Pastor's Corner

He Goes Ahead of You: Hope in the Face of Doubt

Alleluia! Christ is risen. The tomb is empty. The promise holds.

After journeying through a rich Holy Week — from Maundy Thursday's basin and towel, to Good Friday's silence, through the Vigil's fire and font, and on to Easter morning's radiant joy — we continue walking in the season of Resurrection. But the Gospel doesn't end at the tomb. In Matthew's account, the risen Jesus meets his disciples and says:

"Go to Galilee; there you will see me." (Matt. 28:7, 10)

There's comfort in that line: He goes ahead of us. In a world thick with uncertainty — political, personal, global — this Easter promise is a balm. Jesus is not behind us, hoping we figure it out. He's ahead of us, already at work in the future we fear.

But Matthew also tells us something surprisingly honest:

"When they saw him, they worshiped him; but they doubted." (Matt. 28:17)

It's a sentence that rattles our expectations. These are the disciples — the ones who've seen the empty tomb, heard the angel, followed Jesus for years. And still, as they kneel before the risen Christ, they doubt.

The Greek here is striking. It doesn't say "some" doubted. That word isn't there. What Matthew actually writes is:

"They worshiped him; but they doubted."

There's no clean separation — just a holy paradox. As Rev. Dr. Mark Allan Powell has noted, Matthew may be intentionally showing us that worship and doubt often share the same heart. These are not two groups — the faithful and the hesitant — but one body of believers whose faith is mixed with fear, whose praise is tangled with uncertainty.

And what does Jesus do? He doesn't rebuke them. He doesn't withhold the mission. He says, "Go. Make disciples. And know this: I am with you always."

That is the heart of Easter: God is with us — even when we're not sure. Hope is not just for the certain; it's for the unsure, the overwhelmed, the ones holding onto faith by a thread.

Maybe that's you right now. Maybe the resurrection feels real on Sunday, but less so on Tuesday morning. Maybe you've prayed with trembling hands. Maybe you've worshiped while wondering whether hope can outlast the headlines.

If so, hear the Gospel again:

Christ goes ahead of you.
Christ meets you in your doubt.
Christ calls you anyway.
And Christ is with you — always.

This is the kind of hope that reshapes the world — not in spite of our humanity, but right in the middle of it. Alleluia. Amen.

Evangelism

The Evangelism Team engages in various activities that support relationships within the congregation and provide information and a welcoming atmosphere for guests. The creation of an Ambassador Team to greet guests and answer questions is aimed at encouraging return visits and longer association with the congregation. Building relationships with members and guests promotes a culture of warmth and acceptance that aligns with our mission – "We are called as a community of faith to preach the Word, administer the sacraments, and carry out God's mission to our neighbors and the world." The Evangelism Team also facilitates relationships with other organizations and individuals in the community, laying the groundwork for future collaboration and community resource building. When you see name tags, gift bags, and smiling faces, the Evangelism Team is nearby.

Fellowship

Fellowship and Fun at LCBTL aims to unite people through enjoyable activities. We gather in the ARK for meals, game nights, movies, crafts, lectures, and short trips. Everyone, including neighbors and friends, is welcome to join us in building relationships and enjoying God's world together. Join our next fellowship activity!

Education

Education at LCBTL offers diverse opportunities for all interests. We host the annual Vacation Bible School, redesigned as CAMP GRAND(parent), to help grandparents engage visiting grandchildren in a God-centered experience. This event fosters connections among kids, families, and volunteers.

Adult programs throughout the year feature varied, thought-provoking topics led by experienced leaders, including our pastor, retired clergy, and knowledgeable laypersons. Studies may cover books of the Bible, video series discussions, or comparative religion. Participants leave sessions eager to return due to the engaging content and fellowship.

Technology

Technology has become a very necessary part of all of our lives, and no less so in the church. Since COVID, we have been blessed with equipment provided by a former

member to begin the live stream of Sunday morning worship services and sometimes funerals or memorials. The ARK has a large screen TV, additional monitor, and amazing sound system – some of which was recently upgraded with funds from another generous gift from a former member's family. We have added a special system for those needing hearing assistance called "Listen Everywhere" in both buildings, and in the Conference Room we are equipped to participate in educational webinars and meetings via ZOOM and conferencing equipment. Technology is expensive and also ever-changing. We have been so blessed to have been provided with the resources to stay current technologically and continue to be a church that understands the importance of connecting with others, sometimes remotely.


First, Last and Throughout


All items need to be clean, in good condition and working. Non-acceptable items:

We are reminded many places in scripture that we can trust in God in any situation: Psalm 46:1-3

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change,
though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea,
though its waters roar and foam,
though the mountains tremble with its tumult.

How Did LDR Help LCBTL?

Through those who helped build the resources of Lutheran Disaster Response Carolinas, grants were made available to assist congregations in their efforts to be better prepared for disaster. Our LCBTL Safety Team recommended that we secure our doors more effectively to protect those working in the building by adding a"RING DOORBELL" systems to the front and side doors. Our grant application was approved for \$750.00 and covered the cost of the entire system. THANK YOU LDR!
