Pastor's Corner

The first time I pulled into the drive at Lutheran Church By The Lake was in January of 2024. Linda and I were here for the first in-person interviews and conversations in our mutual discernment of whether I would serve as LCBTL's next pastor.

As we drove into the upper parking lot, the doors swung open, and there stood Eric Randall and Sherri Kumle, then President and Vice President of Council. The smiles across their faces were warm and welcoming. I began to feel good about this congregation almost immediately. In the days and weeks that followed, my excitement only continued to grow.

After the call process ended with a Letter of Call extended by the congregation and accepted by me, I began serving as the newest pastor of Lutheran Church By The Lake on April 1, 2024.

My first Council meeting was April 15, 2024, and I quickly began to see the dedication, commitment, and love the Congregation Council held for LCBTL. Yet, just as I was settling in, some members of Council were completing their terms. Eric Randall, Candy Zimmerman, Bill Freiberg, and Donna Ermis finished their service on Council and moved into other forms of ministry and life within the congregation. Though I did not have the chance to work with them as Council members for very long, it was clear that they had been good and faithful servants of God through their leadership.

Since that time, others have completed their Council service, while still others have begun. What has become apparent to me is that this congregation has a long history of dedicated servants who have lived out part of their discipleship through service on Council. That is a gift worthy of deep gratitude.

Today, as I write, LCBTL stands at a new threshold of discipleship. As Sherri Kumle, Bill Kumle, Paul Klein, and Eileen Hurlbut complete their time on Council after six years of faithful service, we also stand ready to begin a new chapter of Council leadership and congregational strategy.

On May 31, 2026, LCBTL will vote to ratify a new Constitution and Bylaws. Having already crossed the first simple-majority vote unanimously, we appear poised to meet the required two-thirds vote for ratification and implementation.

While a Constitution and Bylaws may sound like a formality, this represents a clear and meaningful shift in how the ministry of LCBTL is supported. Council's role will continue to include mission alignment, faithful oversight, and financial responsibility. Yet the work of Council will increasingly move from planning and doing much of the ministry to empowering, equipping, and supporting ministry. The work of ministry belongs to the people of God, and it will be entrusted to the servants and teams called, gifted, and sent to do God's work at this time and in this place.

That is not simply administrative change. It is discipleship. It is stewardship. It is a congregation asking how God is calling us to gather, grow, and go with faithfulness, clarity, and courage.

After two years as your pastor, I have come to realize that the warmth Linda and I felt as we drove up the hill in January 2024 was not a fluke. It was not simply the politeness of a congregation courting a new pastor. Nor was it only the natural warmth and welcome of Eric and Sherri. It was, and is, a reflection of the character of this congregation. LCBTL is a place full of genuine disciples, people striving to do God's work and living

into the gifts and energy that God has so abundantly planted here. The Holy Spirit has been at work in this congregation long before I arrived, and the Holy Spirit is still at work among us now.

For that, I am grateful.

I am grateful for those who have led faithfully in the past. I am grateful for those who are leading now. I am grateful for those who are preparing to step forward. I am grateful for every servant, every team, every ministry, every quiet act of care, every prayer, every generous gift, and every faithful "yes" offered for the sake of Christ and neighbor.

Most of all, I am excited to move forward with you, discovering all the amazing ways God is calling, equipping, empowering, and sending the disciples of Lutheran Church By The Lake to do the very work of Jesus in this place.

God's work is before us. God's Spirit is with us. And by God's grace, we move forward together.

We are grateful for the service of retiring Council members Sherri Kumle, Paul Klein, Eileen Hurlbut, Bill Kumle, Jeanne Thayer, Bill Kite, Charlie Clark and Doug Bauer. We give thanks for those who continue in service in the new Council term: Julienne Leibrandt, Cherlyn Johnson, Bill Hutchinson and Maria Gardner, as well as those below who are willing to serve this congregation in each of the designated capacities:

- **President – 2 Year Term: Bill Hutchinson**

Bill has been a member of LCBTL for 2 ½ years. He has served as our Council Worship Committee Chair for the past 2 years and is an active member of our choir. He recently served as the President of the Savannah River Singers. Up until Bill moved here in October of 2023, he served his previous Lutheran congregation as an Elder. He is a Commissioned Stephan Minister (2000) and also served for six years on the Endowment Committee of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Clyde, Ohio.

- **Vice President – 1 Year Term: Cherlyn Johnson**

Cherlyn has been a member of LCBTL for 3 years. She has served as the VP of Council and Chair of our Nominating Committees for the past 2 years. Cherlyn chaired the 2023 Call Committee and has led various LCBTL projects including Internal Controls, Shepherding Care, and Constitution revisions. Cherlyn has trained and served as a Stephen Minister. She has held senior management positions in Human Resources and Leadership Development in global corporations. She is a life-long Lutheran and was a charter member of a Lutheran mission congregation in Wisconsin.

- **Secretary – 2 Year Term: Julienne Leibrandt**

Julienne moved to SLV in 2018 and joined LCBTL shortly thereafter. She moved here from the Virginia suburbs of Washington DC. She was the secretary for a small Lutheran church for 15 years; prior to that worked at a real estate settlement firm. Julienne has served as the Council Secretary at LCBTL for the last several years. She is an active part of the McCormick Garden Club and participates in two book clubs here in SLV.

- **Financial Secretary – 2 Year Term: Maria Gardner**

Maria has been a member of LCBTL for 2 years. She has served as our Assistant Financial Secretary since March of 2025. Maria previously attended an Episcopal church where she was a member of the prayer chain, altar guild, attended and led Bible studies and was on the hospitality committee. Spring Bible Study

We continue our study in May with the book study of:

Practicing: Changing Yourself to Change the World by Kathy Escobar. It covers ten spiritual practices: Healing, Listening, Loving, Including, Equalizing, Advocating, Mourning, Failing, Resting and Celebrating. While many studies focus on our belief, this one will focus on our practice...how we form our spiritual lives.

Participants are free to purchase the book for their own use although it is not necessary. Pastor Scott Crane will be sharing about a couple of these practices each session, along with giving examples. All will be able to share their own experiences as well as explore other resources pertaining to these practices. An introduction and first two practices/chapters (Healing & Listening) will be explored on the first session scheduled for April 7th. The following sessions of April 14th, 21st and May 5th and 12th will each cover two of the spiritual practices.

May- June- The Three Amigos will present team taught lessons on denominational church practice- Pastor Greg, Pastor Crane, and Pastor Chris Craig Jones will be officiating. Dates: 5/12, 5/19, 5/26 & 6/2

June- July- Chuck Gresham will study Paul's Books over three or four sessions. Dates: 6/9, 6/16, 6/23 & 7/7 or 7/14.

What Is Shepherding Care?

Shepherding Care is a ministry at Lutheran Church By The Lake that combines the **Pastoral Care** of Pastor Greg combined with lay leaders of the congregation who have volunteered to assist him by providing **Coordination of Requests**, (*Sherri Kumle*) and Caring Leadership **in Eucharistic Visits and Calls** (*Candy Zimmerman*), **Prayers** (*Julie Crane*), and **Cards** (*Denise Uitto*).

Should I Connect with Shepherding Care?

Everyone in the congregation is invited to connect with Shepherding Care for themselves, a loved one, or in some cases neighbors and friends if there is a need for prayer. Although prayer is always available for all those in need, Calls, visits, and cards are primarily for the people of Lutheran Church By The Lake.

Why Not Just Make a Request in Person to Pastor or A Lay Leader?

Mentioning needs is always appropriate; however, to ensure that the request is recorded and that your wishes are fulfilled, making a request through Shepherding Care is also recommended.

What Can I Do ANYTIME To Make a Request?

- You may add a name (first name only) to the RED Intercessory Prayer Book
- You may fill out and drop a Request Form in the Gold Box for any of the three caring ministries
- You may place a name in the Prayer Vessel to be read on Sunday morning

How To Get Your Group Info to church members and the wider SLV Community

Miscommunication is a problem for everyone. There are 4 methods to get your announcements out to our church members and also those within the SLV community.

Sunday Bulletin: Our bulletin is printed each **Wednesday** for the upcoming Sunday. Please email your announcement to the church office by **noon on Tuesdays**. We will then print your information in the bulletin. Please write out exactly how you want it stated in the bulletin and instruct the office that you want it placed in the Sunday bulletin

Realm Email "Blast": If you would like to see your announcement sent via email , again, write out exactly how you want it stated in the email and instruct the office that you want an email sent out through Realm and what date you would like to have it sent. Please allow the office staff enough time to prepare the email for distribution. It usually takes us an hour to turn it around.

Monthly Newsletter: Please email your announcement/news exactly how you want it printed in the newsletter. **Deadline for submissions is the 19th of the month** for the next month's newsletter. Again, instruct the office that you are submitting this item for the Newsletter.

SLV NeighborLink: If you would like to see your announcement in NeighborLink, write out exactly how you want it stated in an email and submit to either the Council President or Pastor Greg for approval. They will then send your approved announcement to the office. Please allow all involved enough time to prepare your announcement for submission to NeighborLink. Please inform the Council President or Pastor Greg the dates you want the submission to run. Also make yourself aware of the guidelines involved in a NeighborLink submission.

Most important is the fact that you let the office staff know how you want your communication to be handled:

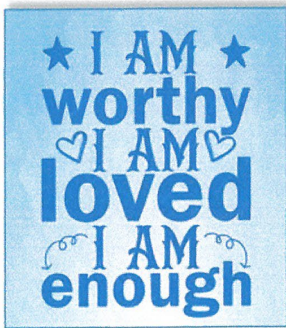
